

Week 42 Highlights

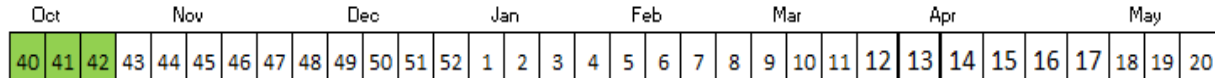
The weekly Influenza Watch summarizes the flu surveillance in the City of Cleveland. The metrics in this report include the number and percentage of emergency department visits for influenza-like illness, confirmed hospitalizations for the flu, and the deaths each week due to pneumonia and influenza.

- This week, flu activity is classified as “Low”
- 2.52% of the 318 deaths reported were due to pneumonia. No influenza deaths were reported this week and there have been no influenza deaths so far this season.
- There were not any confirmed cases of influenza-associated hospitalization reported this week.
- 1.34% of emergency department visits were for flu-like illness

Seasonal Flu Intensity



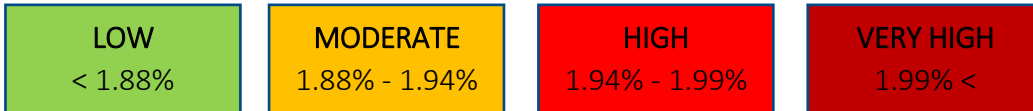

The proportion of Emergency Room visits for influenza-like illnesses is under the low threshold and lower than the 5-years average. This week 57% of visits were among males. Regarding race and ethnicity, 30% of visits were Black or African American individuals; 28% were among White individuals; and 43% of visits were among other racial groups. A little more than third (39%) of visits were among Hispanic or Latin individuals. The median age this week is six years.

There was not an influenza-associated hospitalization (IAH) this reporting week. Since the end of the 2022-2023 flu season there has been three influenza-associated hospitalizations; the last of which was during the last week of September. All three of these hospitalizations have been among Cleveland residents under 65 years of age. COVID-19 has accounted for more hospitalizations so far this fall. Weekly COVID-19 hospitalizations have decreased each week during the month of September and there were four during this reporting week; all of which were among Cleveland residents over 42 years of age.

There have been 8 deaths this reporting week due to pneumonia or influenza-related illnesses (P&I). The proportion of P&I deaths is under the *low* threshold this week. This week, the data shows there was not an influenza or COVID-19-related death. The majority P&I deaths that occurred this season were among individuals aged 45 years and older.
